Public domain land was granted by foreign treaties and gifts to, and purchases by the federal government after 1776, and does not apply to states using the state lands methods.

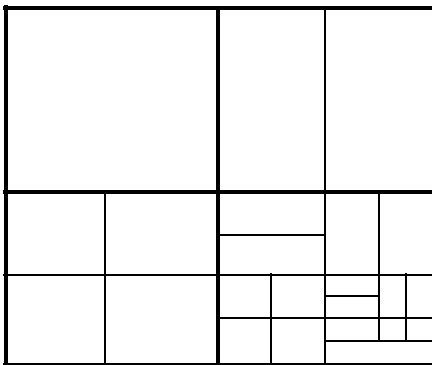

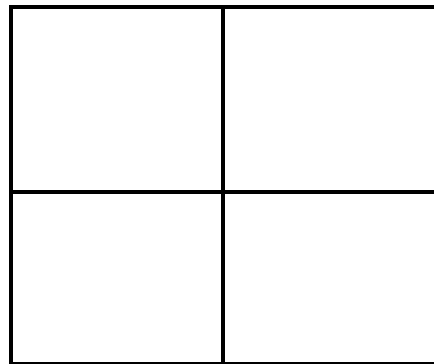
